Hello Michigan socialists!

As June comes to a close, we wrap up the month with a series of rulings from the reactionary Supreme Court that are as repugnant as they are predictable. In a triple play for profiteers and bigots, Republican justices have struck down affirmative action, legalized anti-LGBTQ+ discrimination and ruled the Biden administration's already meager student loan relief plan "unconstitutional."

As this newsletter drops we will be going into the extended July 4th weekend. While any time off for (some) workers to spend with their loved ones is worth celebrating, this is often a curious time of year for Socialists -- and in 2023 a very curious year indeed for the United States more broadly. As parades and explosions implore us to celebrate "America", the legacy of America's past and its increasingly fascistic present leaves very little to cheer about.

Socialists have debated the virtues of embracing American "patriotism" for over a century. In the wake of WWII, many Socialists and Communists hoped a sort of peace had been won between laborers and a more liberal capitalist ruling class. Sadly these hopes were dashed by the ensuing decades of McCarthyism, redbaiting, and economic strip-mining of the working class.


Some Socialists argued then (and some do now) for the strategic value of tying Socialist ideas and our demand for workers' rights to the mythology of the American revolution. While "life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness" are certainly at the core of our Socialist agenda, we cannot traffic in the half-truths and revisionist histories surrounding the 18th century "revolutionaries." Though this topic could fill more pages than this newsletter, suffice to say that among the truths WE hold to be self-evident is the fact that referring to slave owners and colonizers as "revolutionaries" is ridiculous on its face. More workers in 2023, especially younger workers, increasingly regard these narratives with apathy rather than loyalty and are far more concerned with bread and butter issues. Embracing reactionary patriotism was always a dubious strategy for Socialists, even more so in an era when workers are beginning to question the validity of the United States and capitalism.

If we feel the need for patriotism, let us embrace our own history and founding figures -- the courageous slave rebellions of the 18th and 19th centuries; the farm workers in the southwest who fought for their rights in the face of violent anti-union vigilantes; the black sharecroppers who unionized in Alabama under threat of white supremacist terror; the queer radicals at Stonewall who revolted against revolting police harassment and repression; and the long, long, list of other workers who stood up to the bosses and their violent goons, demanding fair pay, better hours, and safer working conditions.

If we celebrate anything as Socialists on the fourth of July, let it be the radical tradition of an American working class standing up for itself and against the U.S. empire.

All empires spin self-serving myths, and in the US the most potent of these is that America is a force for democracy around the world. Yet there is a tradition of American anti-imperialism that exposes this misleading

mythology. American Insurgents is a surprising, revelatory history of anti-imperialism in the United States since the American Revolution. It charts the movements against empire from the Indian Wars and the expansionism of the slave South to the Anti-Imperialist League of Mark Twain and Jane Addams. Seymour crafts a lively and transparent explanation of why some of these movements succeeded and others failed. The result is a vital perspective for those organizing antiwar resistance today.
