Rest in Power Deandre Jones

Deandre Jones died on February 24th.

Deandre Jones was beloved by his community, and for several years him and his family had been fighting a struggle to hold Graphic Packaging International accountable for its pollution of the Northside neighborhood.

Deandre Jones suffered from asthma- residents of the Northside neighborhood experience disproportionately high rates of asthma. Fumes from the nearby Graphic Packaging and the city wastewater treatment plant are documented sources of hydrogen sulfide gas which exacerbates that condition.

Deandre Jones' sister died of an asthma attack when she was 17 years old.

Deandre Jones and his sister were plaintiffs in a lawsuit filed against Graphic Packaging, the city of Kalamazoo and state and county officials.

The life expectancy in the Northside neighborhood, a predominately black, working class neighborhood in Kalamazoo, MI, is 14 years less than surrounding areas.

I never met Deandre. I have been following the struggle against Graphic Packaging and speaking out on it for several years now. Many of my colleagues and comrades have organized in this struggle- many live in the neighborhood and have asthma themselves. What is going on in the Northside neighborhood is a text book case of environmental racism. The parts of Kalamazoo on the whiter side of historical redlining do not have to deal with hydrogen sulfide gas.

They do not have to deal with the noxious, unhealthy aerosols the state refers to as "nuisance odors."

They do not have to bury their children from asthma attacks.

I have written before in our newsletters about sacrifice zones, about the human costs of capitalism, and about those in marginalized communities who struggle against it. Those very brave people who- staring down the leviathan of industry sickening their neighbors- plant their feet and fight- and lead others to do so.

Deandre was one of those people. He was 33 years old. May his example inspire us to organize and continue to fight against exploitation, for our rights, and for clean air.




Ireland, Colonialism, and the Unfinished Revolution by Robbie McVeigh and Bill Rolston

Ireland's prime minister recently resigned, and on his way out challenged President Biden directly on his material support for the genocide in

Gaza. He said, "We see our history in their eyes, a story of displacement, of dispossession, and (in which) national identity questions are denied. Forced emigration, discrimination, and now hunger." McVeigh and Rolston's book brings the history the prime minister was gesturing to in vivid detail, from England's protoimperial engagement with Ireland in 1155, through the struggle for Independence in the early 20th century, to how that legacy reverberates into the modern day- and how the Socialist republic envisioned by Irish revolutionaries like James Connolly has yet to come to fruition (hence, an unfinished revolution). Phillip Foner trains their eye on the history of women workers in the U.S. in this sweeping and gripping history. From early examples of indentured servants organizing in the

The Palestinian (1977)

A documentary in the shadow on the Lebanese Civil War- ostensibly over the extent to which their government should exercise solidarity with Palestinian resistance- this nearly 50 year old film documents both the political situation of exiled Palestinians and the war crimes perpetrated against them by the Israeli government.
